

To aid our maintenance team in addressing your work orders as quickly and efficiently as possible, here is how work orders should be submitted.

- Call in work needing to be done, even if it is only one item.

A reminder, per Highlands' policy, <u>ALL windows and exterior doors must</u> <u>be kept closed</u> when the temperature is below 40 degrees. If it is verified that you are in violation of this policy, an attempt will be made to inform you that you need to close door or window. If we cannot reach you, we will send maintenance personnel to close it. Review the entire policy under Open Doors and Windows for complete details and fines.

Snow Plowing of Parking spaces

Center of parking lots are normally plowed after snow accumulation of 2 inches or more-Parking spaces are not plowed on week-ends or holidays. When it is determined that parking spaces will be plowed, a **Groupcast** notification will be sent between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 am. in the morning. This notification will only be to let you know that Highlands intends to plow the parking spaces. You will receive another notice when it is time to move your vehicle out of the parking lot.

You should take the time between notifications to clean off your vehicles in preparation for the notification that will follow later in the day to remove your vehicle from the parking lot. **Please do not move your vehicle out of the parking lot until you receive the second notice. This will give those members that are getting the second notice room to park on the street.** Once the parking spaces are cleared and salted, a third notice will be sent to notify you so that you can move your vehicles back into the parking lot. *Again, you should move your vehicles back into the parking lot, as soon as possible, to provide space on the street for other Members to park that will also need to move their vehicles out.*

If you do not receive **Groupcast** notifications the only notice you will get is when a Highlands vehicle comes into the parking lot blowing the horn. You will only have (10) ten minutes to remove your vehicle from the parking lot without being subjected to a fine.

During the Winter month's it is more important than ever to keep your vehicle's bumper off the sidewalk. This will assist our staff as they work to clear your sidewalks. When your bumper sits over the curb and sidewalk it creates a safety issue and could result in unsafe walking conditions. It also makes snow removal more difficult and could result in damage to your vehicle. **THANK YOU for your cooperation!**

Hoppin' John Ingredients

- 6 thick-cut bacon slices, chopped
- 4 celery stalks, sliced
- 1 medium-size yellow onion, chopped
- 1 small green bell pepper, chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, chopped (about 1 Tbsp.)
- 1 tsp. chopped fresh thyme
- 1/2 tsp. black pepper
- 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 11/2 tsp. kosher salt, divided
- 8 cups lower-sodium chicken broth
- 4 cups fresh or frozen black-eyed peas
- 2 Tbsp. olive oil

TO BEGIN:

Cook bacon in a Dutch oven over medium-high, stirring occasionally, until starting to crisp, about 10 minutes.

Add celery, onion, bell pepper, garlic, thyme, black pepper, cayenne, and 1 teaspoon of the salt.

Cook, stirring occasionally, until onion is tender, about 8 minutes.

Add broth and black-eyed peas, and bring to a boil over medium-high. Reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer until peas are tender, about 40 minutes.

Drain pea mixture, reserving cooking liquid. Return pea mixture and 1 cup of the cooking liquid to Dutch oven. Cover to keep warm; set aside.

- 11/2 cups uncooked white rice
- Fresh green onions, sliced


Black Eyed Peas are thought to bring good luck to those who eat them on New Year's Day Heat oil in a medium saucepan over medium-high. Add rice and cook, stirring often, until fragrant and lightly toasted, 3 to 4 minutes. Stir in 3 cups of the reserved cooking liquid and remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt. Bring to a boil, and reduce heat to medium-low; cover and cook until rice is tender, 15 to 18 minutes.

Gently stir into pea mixture in Dutch oven. Stir in remaining cooking liquid, 1/4 cup at a time, until desired consistency is reached. Sprinkle servings with sliced green onions.

Are you signed up for GroupCast? When you receive a call from the Highlands



Office, and you are not expecting a call from us, please let it go to voicemail. Once the call has been completed, you can listen to the message before returning the call. The office personnel answering the phone do not always know what message has been sent. Don't forget that you can also set up your account to have these messages sent to you as a text or an email.



Anyone residing in your townhouse must be listed as an occupant of your household. If it is discovered that you have a unregistered occupant residing in your household, this is considered a violation of your Occupancy Agreement and one of the following will occur:

- 1) A 30-day notice to terminate the membership will be issued OR
- You will be subjected to paying surcharge for the duration of your residency at Highlands (even if your combined income is under the income limit)
 AND you will need to show proof of the following:
 - a) when the unregistered occupant moved in
 - b) annual income since the unregistered occupant moved in

Once the above information is turned in, a determination will be made as to whether

the household income was over the income limits at that time.

If so, you will be responsible for surcharge back to that date.
